### **Saint of the Month St. John Dwarf -October 17th**

John was born 339 A.D. in Thebes, Egypt and he was called Kolobos due to his short stature. At the age of 18 he and his brother decided to become monks and joined a monastery in the desert of Scetes under Saint Pambo. As a monk St. John was known for his austerity and obedience. He was so obedient that when St.Pambo asked him to plant and water a dry piece of wood he kept watering it for three years until it grew into a great tree. After St.Pambo's departure St. John became a priest and an abbot founding a monastery around the tree of obedience. In 395 A.D. the barbarians known as Mazices invaded and St. John had to flee to Mount Colzim, where he died 10 years later. Info gathered from Catholic Online.



**Book of the Month:  
It is Right and Just  
By Scott Hahn and Brandon Mcginley**

Surprised it took me awhile to get to a Scott Hahn book. It is Right and Just, explains why much of what is wrong in our society is that we expect to keep our faith private and just to ourselves. What authors Hahn and Mcginley do is to destroy this assumption step by step and explain how it is ultimately wrong. The book does a good job of explaining theology and philosophy in a readable and easily digestible way in under 200 pages. My only complaint is that the book doesn't give more concrete things to do to help stop this, but neither Hahn or Mcginley are political commentators so it's understandable.
