Saint of the Month Our Lady of Guadalupe- December 12th

On December 9,1531 Juan Diego, a recently converted Mexican peasant, was walking to Mass when he heard a beautiful song. Walking towards the music he encounters the Virgin Mary on what is called Tepeyac Hill. She instructs him to go to the bishop and ask him to build a church there. Juan goes to the bishop who initially doesn't believe him, so Juan returns to the hill and ask her what to do. She tells him return once again and ask. The bishop this time demands a sign and Juan promises him one the following day. However, Juan's uncle fell seriously ill and he had to spend the next two days with him. As Juan was going to get a priest to perform last rights for his uncle Our Lady appeared to him and asked him go the bishop and give him the sign. She asked Juan to go to Tepeyac Hill and gather flowers and put it in his tilma (poncho) to show the bishop. When Juan dropped his tilma the image of the Virgin was painted on it. Our Lady appeared one last time to cure Juan's uncle and asked to be called Our Lady of Guadalupe. Millions converted because of this image and millions still flock to the still standing church with the aforementioned image in it. She was declared patroness of the Americas in 1945 by Pope Pius the XII. (Info from Catholic Online)
