NOI last month was \$5,147.83.

Page 1 shows a net ordinary income profit of \$3,977.83 There were no unexpected expenses for the month. A \$1,000 donation was received by the corporation and along with \$150 cash back from our credit card brought our Net Income to \$5,147.83 Page 2 shows our net ordinary income was up about \$6,080 from last December. Net ordinary income for the fiscal year is up about \$7,010. Page 4 is our current balance sheet showing our checking account balance at \$45,863.49. Page 5 is the current budget report. Pages 6 and 7 show the checking account transactions for the month.

Saint of the Month

St. Joan of Valois-February 4th

Joan Valois was born on April 23rd, 1464 to King Louis XI of France. She was raised along with her sister by the devout Linieres family which gave them a good education. In 1471, Louis ordered the reciting of the Hail Mary throughout the country, Joan developed a fondness for the prayer and received a vision of the holy Virgin to found a religious order. In 1476, she was married to her cousin, Louis of Orleans but was treated very poorly by him. In 1498, Louis ascended to the French throne and attempted to have his marriage annulled due to her being a hunchback and wanting to marry the wealthy Duchess of Brittany. Joan fought bitterly against the annulment and faced vicious rumors of witchcraft, but in vain. After her annulment she set out in 1500 to form a new order of nuns, the order of the Annunciation of The Blessed Virgin Mary. In 1504, the order was officially established and became noted as a strict

abbotess. She died in 1505, but when her grave was desecrated in 1562 by angry Protestants, it was found to be incorrupt, before it was burnt. She was beatified in 1742 and Canonized in 1950. Info gotten from Catholic online
