Saint of the Month St. Hilary of Poitiers- January 13th

St. Hilary was born around 300 AD to an upper class pagan family in Rome. The early life of Hilary was spent trying to find the meaning of life. After many experiments with different religions and philosophies, he finally read the Bible and found the true God he had been yearning for. He converted to Christianity with his wife and daughter and shortly afterwards was proclaimed bishop of Poitiers, France in about 350 AD. Hilary quickly got in trouble for denouncing the Arians (those whom deny Christ's divinity) and the emperor of Rome, Constantius II, sent him into exile to Phrygia, Turkey in 356 AD. While in exile he continued to govern his diocese and wrote several works defending the Holy Trinity and commentaries on the gospel. After Constantius died in 361 AD, Hilary returned to his diocese in Poitiers and wrote several hymns based on some that he heard in the east. These became the first known written hymns in the west. Hilary continued to combat Arianism until his death in 367 AD. (Info from Catholic Online)
