# St. Elizabeth of Portugal July 4th

St. Elizabeth was born in Aragon (modern day Spain) in 1271 to the Aragonese King Peter III and Constance of Sicily where she received a pious education and was known to be devote even at a young age. At the age of 17 she was married to King Denis of Portugal. He proved to be a terrible husband and adulterer due to rumors that those in court who disliked her piety had spread. On one occasion a jealous page at court started a rumor that the queen was having an affair with another page. The king ordered an assassin to kill the good page, but he was at mass and the assassin killed the bad page by mistake. King Denis realizing he almost made a terrible mistake decided to atone of his ways and became a better husband. As queen Elizabeth was known for her generosity to the poor and as a peace maker between the various kingdoms even on occasion riding between two armies to prevent battles. After her husbands death Elizabeth joined the third order Franciscans to continue her work for the poor and sick. After helping negotiate a peace treaty between Castille and Portugal she died of fever on July 4th in 1336. She was given the title peacemaker due to her diplomatic efforts and was Canonized in 1625 by Pope Urban the VIII.
