Saint of the Month **St. Marcellin of Champagnat**

Born in Marllhes, France in 1789 during the chaos of the French Revolution. He couldn't attend school until eleven years of age due to the constant turmoils. While there he was horrified at the way teachers were cruelly treating their students so he left after one day. This made it hard for St. Marcellin later in 1805 when he joined the seminary and lacked education. However, due to his hard work and perseverance he was able to be ordained in 1816. Soon afterward, he came upon a poor, young farmer who had appalling knowledge of the faith. This event inspired St. Marcellin to found a religious order called The Maurist Brothers of the School, which would provide improved Catholic education to poor villagers. Very soon his schools were based on his idea that "to educate children you must love them and love them all equally." This concept of teaching helped in adding dozens of new schools per year until his death in 1840. He was Canonized in 1999 by St. John Paul II as the patron of education and teachers.

Book of the Month: **Crossing the Threshold of Hope** **By John Paul II**

Very similar to Cardinal Sarah's book from last month, this one contains conversations that St. John Paul II had with a reporter on a variety of topics dealing with more general Catholic principles rather than political questions. It is a good reminder of our Catholic values and has some good ways to think about our current era. It is also pretty short, so go check it out.
