The Duck Derby is on this year... as of right now. The Village is moving ahead with plans to host Memorial Fest on May 29th. With Village Park being remodeled there are some new possibilities for our council to increase our event revenue. There will be a kid's area up by the new amphitheater where we have an opportunity to sell food and duck tickets. Currently the Optimist club has first shot at

selling food, we are throwing our hat in the ring for this if they decide not to do it. We will be looking for people to man a table in the kid's area to sell duck tickets.

The remodeling done at Village Park will **NOT** impact what is happening on Main Street. The main stage will still be on Main Street as it has been in the past. Our beer tent will be set up for us by a company hired by the village for the event. Those who have done set up and tear down know how big of a win this is for us! By the pavilion there will be a bags tournament which will help drive our food sales up from what we saw in 2019. Sorry, We're Open will be performing at the pavilion as they have in the past.

During our meeting on February 17th, we looked at making a couple of changes. The first change is we are not doing a silent auction. With companies trying to recover from the Covid lock down and restrictions we did not feel it was proper to ask local companies to donate items. The second thing is with the growth of the event on Main Street we are looking to cut back on the activities held back at the clubhouse after the race. We will still have the clubhouse open for those who want to hang out there after the race. The last two events we have seen a drop off in people returning to the clubhouse for the after party. With manpower to help with this event starting to shrink and potential expansion into Village park, we need to focus on where the revenue is made. If someone wants to keep the events going at the clubhouse and is willing to run it, we will support you. There is also a strong chance there will not be a parade this year due to a lack of people signing up to participate in it. With that we currently are not planning on a Memorial Day event at the clubhouse.

We need more participation from our members to help with planning this event. Our next meeting is March 30th, 7:00pm at the clubhouse. Our last meeting had 7 attendees. We need more hands involved with planning and running our biggest fundraising event of the year. Many Hands lighten the load. We hope to see you on March 30th!

Saint of the Month Saint Casmir of Poland March 4th

Saint Casmir was born in 1458 the second son of king Casmir. While growing up he was noticed for his piety. When he was 13 his Father attempted to have installed as the king of Hungary, but Casmir refused calling it unchristian to take another country's land. He was put in a castle for his refusal. Later Casmir was regent briefly of Poland for his father and his regency was known for his care of the poor. He died in 1484 at age 26 and later canonized in 1522.
