Saint of the Month Bl. Emilian Kovch March 25th

A Ukrainian blessed for our brothers in the war. Emilian Kovch was born in 1884 in western Ukraine to a Greek Catholic priest, priests in the Greek Rite could get married. He soon took up his father's occupation and became a priest, as well as getting married and had six children. During the Russian Revolution he served as an Army Chaplain, but returned home to western Ukraine which was under Polish control. He was noted for the care of the orphans, organizing Eucharistic processions and rallied for Ukrainian rights. In 1939, the Soviets invaded and Father Kovch was sent to prison but soon escaped. Two years later the Nazi's invaded, and Father Kovch led efforts to save as many Jews in his village as possible by giving them baptismal certificates. He was envtually found out and arrested in 1942 and later sent to the concentration camp, Majdanek in August 1943. While there he continued to comfort prisoners, heard confessions, and said Mass until his death on March 25th of 1944. He was declared Blessed by Pope John Paul II in 2001. Book of the Month: Let the Fire Fall By Michael Scanlan
