
Knight of the Month - Robert "Bob" Steliga

Catholic book review: Miracles Do happen by Sister Briege McKenna

This book tells the story of Sister Briege McKenna, a real life spiritual healer detailing her own spiritual journey to Christ and the many people with God's her was able to heal physically, and spiritually. What I enjoyed most is how Briege own slow awakening to her gifts of healing, and how she had to struggle before finnally accepting christ role for her. The book is fairly short at 170 pages, and Briege gives lot of great advice and explains many aspects of the faith. Definite recommendation.

Saint of the month St. Joan of Arc May 30th

Born in 1412 to pious peasants in Doromy France, Joan ever since an early age heard the voices of angels and saints. When she was 13 she had a vision to of St.Michael, St.Margaret, and St.Catherine to expel the English from France and help the French Prince the Dauphin to reclaim his throne. Three years latter she final set to visit the Dauphin and ask his permission to lead his army. After some lengthy deliberation the Dauphin allowed Joan to help relieve the siege of Orleans. Armed only with a banner she was able to relieve the siege and win several subsequent battles eventually taking reims allowing the dauphin to become king. Joan however was soon captured by the Burgundians, Englands allies, and sold the English. There despite giving a near flawless defence she was found guilty of heresy and burned at the stake in 1431 at the age of 19. In 1456 Pope Callixtus the third had the trial repealed and Joan found innocent. She was canonized in 1920 by Pope Benedict 15th.
