Saint of the Month St.Albert the Great -November 15th

St.Albert the Great was born sometime before 1200 in most likely Lauingen Germany. He would be educated in the university of Padua where he got a lifelong love of Aristotle and had an encounter with the Virgin Mary to become a Dominican in 1223. He would become a famous lecturer at a series of universities before becoming master of Theology at the university of Paris where he taught St. Thomas Aquinas. He become renowned for his knowledge of variety of subjects, including science, Philosophy, Theology and much more. He was appointed provincial of the Dominican order in 1254 and later in 1260 as bishop of Regensburg where was known to serve with skill and humility. After resigning from the bishopric he spent the rest of his days preaching crusades, solving diplomatic crisis, and defending his died pupil Thomas Aquinas from charges of heresy. He died in 1280, declared a saint in 1622 and declared a Doctor of the Church in 1931. (Info gotten from Catholic Online)
